



ADVENTURE AND EXPLORATION IN WYOMING

Day to Day Travel Itinerary

Huge mountains, world-renowned guides, learning and adventure around every bend. We raft a frontier river, spend amazing days in the shadow of the Grand Teton mountains, and learn about Old Faithful and Yellowstone's bison and wolves from expert naturalists. In dinosaur country we dig with experts in an actual fossil bed, and splash in world famous hot springs.

Day 1 Arrival Salt Lake City

Our adventure begins in Salt Lake, where we have lunch upon arrival and transfer to the University of Utah for a fun ROPES course. Here we have a great time with new friends. This afternoon we journey north into Wyoming, for dinner and lodging in beautiful Afton.

Day 2 Afton to Jackson

Viewing famous "Intermittent Springs" after breakfast, we depart Afton driving north through the Star Valley, and arrive in Jackson Hole at lunch time. Check in at world famous Teton Science School and orientation activities this afternoon and evening.

Day 3 Teton Science School

Teton Science School activities begin. We explore the wondrous landscapes of Jackson Hole, viewing bison and other wildlife, gazing at glacial peaks, and learning all about the environment of this amazing place.

Day 4 Teton Science School to Yellowstone

Teton Science School activities continue with close up looks at mountain peaks, study of endangered species, and viewing of elk and other animals. This afternoon we transfer to Yellowstone National Park. We will visit Old Faithful and take readings of the geysers and hot springs in the Upper Geyser Basin. Lodging in Yellowstone National Park cabins.

Day 5 Yellowstone Institute

Full day with the Yellowstone Institute, exploring the park and subjects ranging from the human history of Yellowstone, to grizzly habitat and protection, wolf reintroduction and Old Faithful Geyser. Afternoon visit to the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone, for viewing and program on Yellowstone geology and the ecology of the Yellowstone river.

Day 6 Cody

Morning departure for Cody. Arrival and transfer to Shoshone River for rafting adventure in wild and scenic red rock canyon. Guides will tell tales of frontier life, geology of red rock canyon, and point out wildlife of the area. This afternoon we explore history Cody, and this evening attend the Cody Nite Rodeo.

Day 7 Thermopolis-Dinosaur Dig

Early morning transfer to Thermopolis for dinosaur dig and paleontology of the Jurassic Era. Part of the day will be spent digging at the quarry site, and part in the lab learning how fossils are prepared. This afternoon, we take a dip in world famous Thermopolis Hot Springs. Late afternoon departure to Evanston, and last-evening festivities.

Day 8 Return Home

Transfer to Salt Lake, with stop at historic Ft. Bridger on the Oregon Trail for lunch and western history activities. Afternoon flights home.
